## **Leadership Morris is Helping Hurricane Sandy Victims**

The Morris County Chamber’s Leadership Morris Graduating Class of 2012 continues to serve those rebuilding after Hurricane Sandy. The first efforts began with a food drive in December, lead by Dena Moscola, CEO of Resolutions Coaching & Training. Thanks to a Book Signing/ Networking Event and [www.YouGiveGoods.com](http://www.YouGiveGoods.com), lots of healthy food was donated to NJ’s Salvation Army.

The next adventure was volunteering on 1/19, coordinated by Eric Gabrielson, Business Development for ReCommunity Recycling and Dena Moscola. Joining Eric and Dena were Michael Lupton of Wells Fargo Advisors, Doug Lippin of Wyndham Worldwide Corporation, Mary Manser of Picatinny Arsenal, Mark Spaldo of Boy Scouts of America, Michael Goldberg of A Shoulder to Cry On. The group volunteered at NJ’s Salvation Army’s Disaster Recovery Center in Hazlet for a very interesting, educational and heart-warming day. The Center provides food, baby supplies, household goods and clothing to about 100 families per day - double the anticipated amount. The group set-up storage rooms, restocked shelves, organized displays, assisted and comforted citizens approved by FEMA to receive goods donated by various businesses.

At day’s end, the center’s full time staff shared that prior to that day the most they served in 10 hours was 104 families. Thanks to Leadership Morris assistance, 84 families were served in less than half the time = >50% increase over their record. The Salvation Army expressed extreme gratitude for the Leadership Morris efforts, results and willingness. “It would have taken 2- 3 days for them to do what we did in a short period. They will be the first to tell you, they always need volunteers”, says Gabrielson.

Gabrielson added, “ I got to help a family of 4 with 2 kids not far in age from my own. It wasn’t hard to see myself in their position having lost most of their belongings in 1 day. Remarkably, most did not seem burdened, expressing continuous gratitude to the Salvation Army and even sharing a few laughs. It was a great experience!”

The stories encountered that day were shocking, sad and humbling. Witnessing the devastation was frightening. One couple with 2 small children shared that they had only returned to their home for 2 months after losing it to Hurricane Irene before Sandy came and destroyed it AGAIN. After they found temporary housing, the husband suffered TWO strokes. They do not have much money but thanks to the Salvation Army, they have hope and are smiling.

The Leadership Morris graduates will continue to serve. It is critical that we keep our neighbors victimized by Sandy close in mind because they still need immeasurable assistance, and will for some time. Bonnie-Lynn Nadzeika (Leadership Morris '09) is a lifelong Morris County resident and fan of local history. Childhood trips to Washington's Headquarters and Fosterfields Living Historical Farm turned into a career in museums and she spent 12 years as Director of the Morris County Historical Society and is currently a member of the Morris County Heritage Commission. In 2012 she wrote her first book for Arcadia Publishing's Images of America series. Nadzeika's book is entitled *Morristown* and utilizes postcard images to tell the story of the community.

There have been many books written on the history of Morristown and there will certainly be many more. The seat of Morris County, the history of Morristown is synonymous with the history of America. Whether it's the history of the Revolutionary War or the Industrial Revolution, Morristown played a part. Drawing on postcards from both public and private collections, the text covers both familiar and new territory. Chapters range from George Washington Slept Here to the Gilded Age. Images of a more recent vintage, familiar to Morristownians, are also included. The work seeks to appeal to both long time students of Morristown history and the armchair reader who wants to learn the highlights of local history.

Even chapters tracing the familiar stories of Washington's two winter encampments, and the rich and famous of the Gilded Age, include lesser known stories and facts. George Washington Slept here not only includes images of well-known sites like the Ford Mansion, but lesser known sites such as Leddell's (or Liddell's) Mill. Stories from the Gilded Age not only include details of the lives of the wealthy, but also of the servant class that supported their lavish lifestyle. There are tales of the various immigrant groups that worked for the well-to-do. Included are also lesser known stories of the wealthy, such as the political work of Alice Hopkins, a member of Morristown's elite and a tireless worker for women's right to vote.

Readers will also enjoy a virtual historical tour of downtown Morristown. Using postcard images from the 1890s to the 1960s, the town is portrayed as it existed 100 years ago as well as 50 years ago. Starting on South Street and tracing a route around the Green, up Speedwell Avenue and down Washington Avenue, readers will learn about the stores and businesses that once lined these streets. From the offices of the Pocono Mountain Ice Company to the "skyscraper" Babbitt Building, numerous buildings were carefully identified through extensive research in historic Morristown directories.
